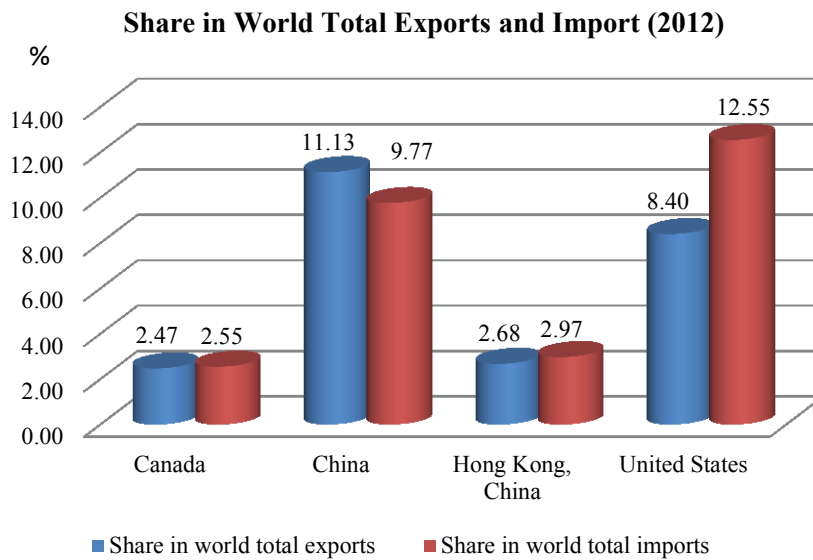


China - Share in World Total Exports and Imports - 2012

The Chinese government called to enhance the policies to expand their imports in September, 2014. The enhanced policies for imports of technology, products and services aim to help meet the domestic demand, improve product quality, promote entrepreneurship and innovation, and upgrade economic structure. The priorities of imports will be given to import of high-tech equipment and key parts as well as the service on research, design, energy saving and environmental protection.

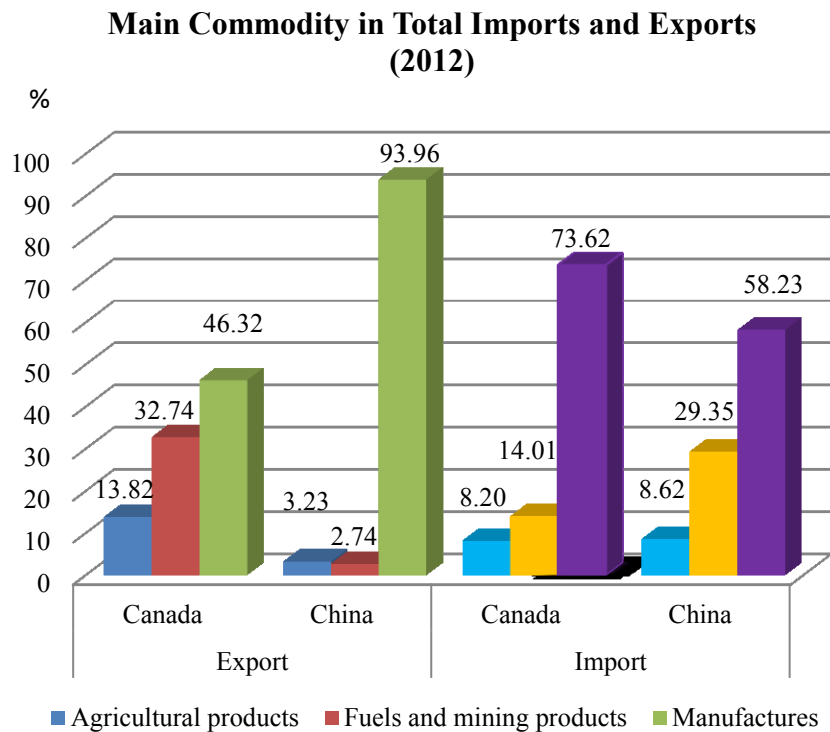
The analysis, share in world total exports and imports in 2012, provides the first hand data in China and Canada international trade in:

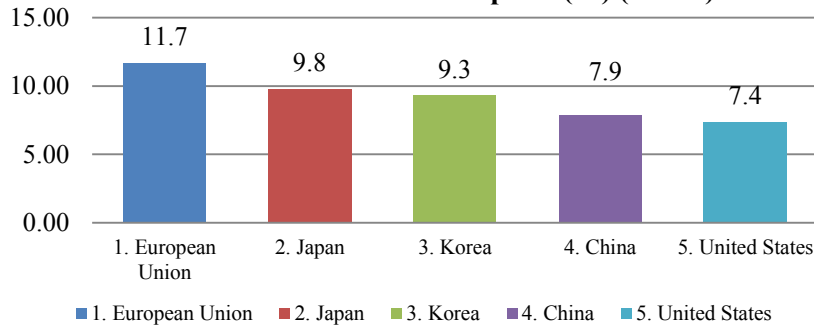
- Chinese share in world total imports was 9.77% in 2012. It ranked in the second after the United States at 12.55%.
- However, Chinese share in world total exports was 11.13% in 2012. The United States was 8.40%.
- Canadian share in world total exports was 2.47% and less than Hong Kong at 2.68%.
- Canadian share in world total imports was 2.55% and also less than Hong Kong at 2.97%.

- Chinese manufacture exports were the 93.96%, agricultural products were 3.23% and fuels and mining products were 2.74% in 2012.
- Chinese manufacture imports were the 58.23%, agricultural products were 8.62% and fuels and mining products were 29.35%.
- Canadian manufacture exports were the 46.32%, agricultural products were 13.82% and fuels and mining products were 32.74% in 2012.
- Canadian manufacture imports were the 73.62%, agricultural products were 8.20% and fuels and mining products were 14.01%.



China - Share in World Total Exports and Imports - 2012

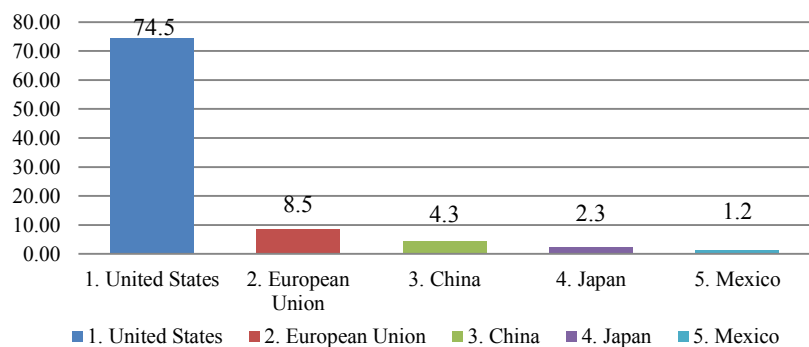
Main Destination in Total Imports (%) (China)



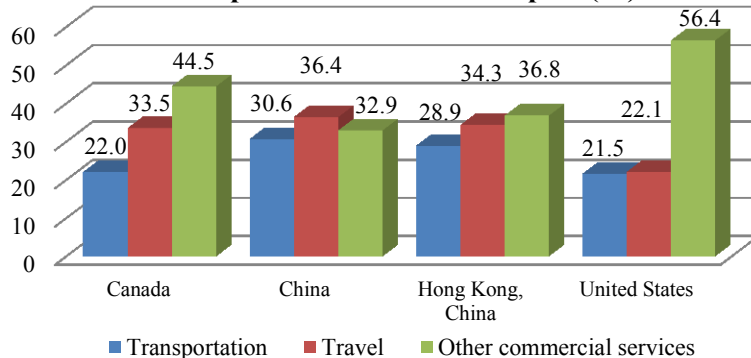
- Canada was not been listed in the Chinese top 5 main import destination in 2012.
- European Union was the top one listed in Chinese main import destination. The imports from European Union were 11.7%.
- The import from Japan was 9.8%, Korea was 9.3%, and the United States was 7.4% respectively.

- China was the top three Canadian main export destination in 2012. The export from China was 4.3%.
- The United States was the top one Canadian main export destination. The exports from the United States were 74.5%.
- The export to European Union was 8.5%, Japan was 2.3%, and Mexico was 1.2% respectively.

- Chinese travel service imports were 36.4%, transportation service imports were 30.6% and other commercial services imports were 32.9% in 2012.
- Canadian travel service imports were 33.5%, transportation service imports were 22.0% and other commercial services imports were 44.5% in 2012.

- Chinese travel service exports were 26.3%, transportation service exports were 20.4% and other commercial services exports were 53.3% in 2012.
- Canadian travel service exports were 22.4%, transportation service exports were 17.0% and other commercial services exports were 60.6% in 2012.
