

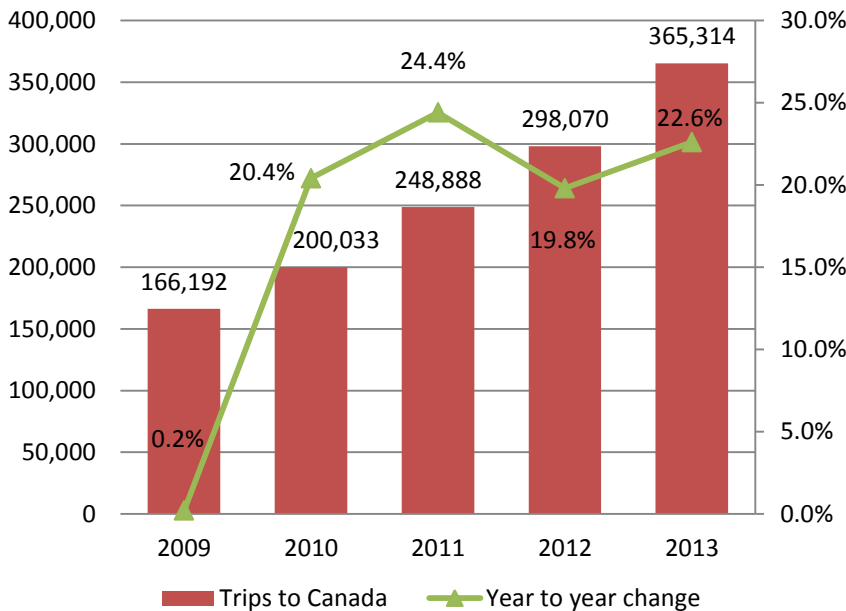

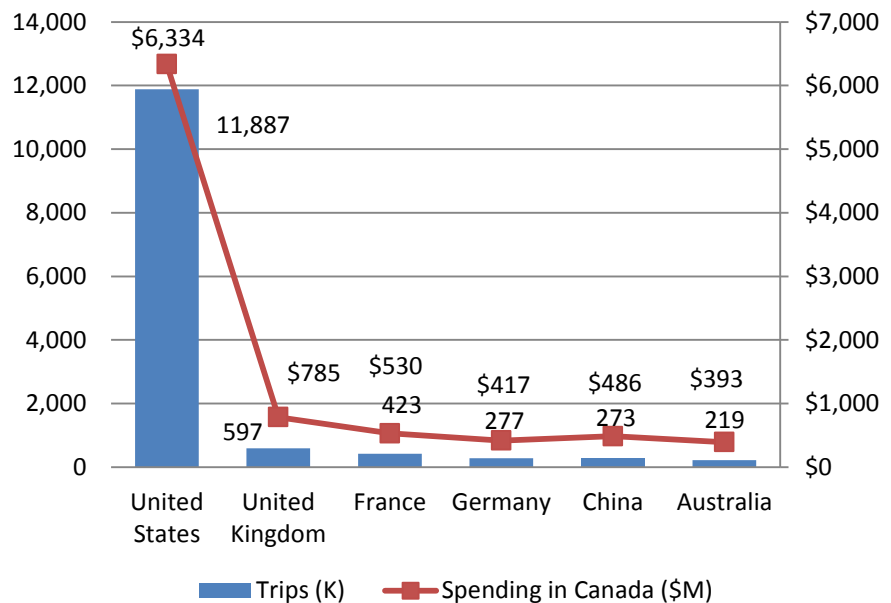
Tourist inflow from China to Canada



- The granting of Approved Destination Status (ADS) to Canada by China in June 2010 significantly enhanced the promotion of Canada as a touristic destination for Chinese customers.
- As a result, Chinese arrivals to Canada expanded from 20.4% in 2010 to 24.4% in 2011, a further 19.8% in 2012, and 22.6% in 2013.
- On average, Chinese travelers spend \$219 per day for a total of expenditure of \$485.6 million in 2012.

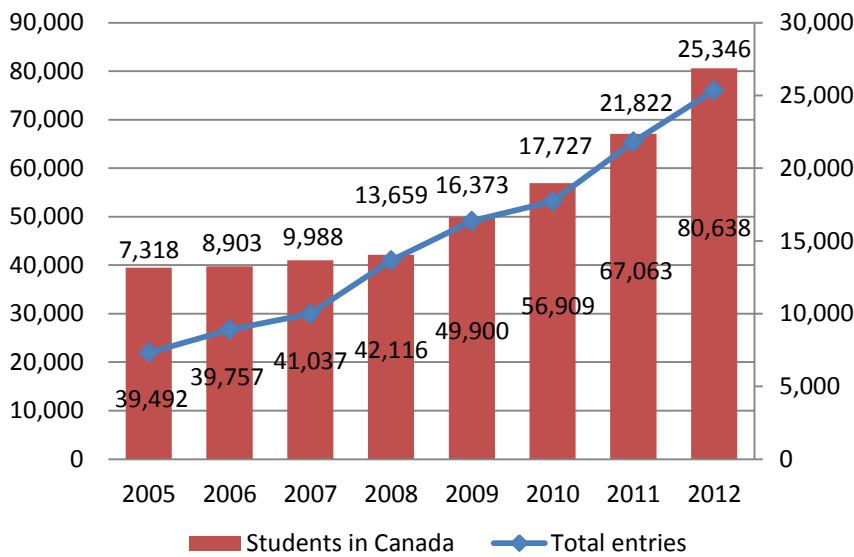
Travelers to Canada by Country of Origin (2012)

- China ranked the fourth (total of 277,000 travelers) to Canada in 2013;
- Chinese travelers spend \$1,780 per trip for a total of expenditure of \$486 million in 2012;
- The United States ranked the top and expenditure of \$6,334 million, followed by the United Kingdom at the second, France at the third, Germany at the fourth and Australia at the sixth.

Chinese Students in Canada



- In accordance with Canada's International Education Strategy, significant efforts are deployed to promote Canada as a destination of choice for Chinese students.
- In 2012, China ranked first in terms of country of origin of foreign students in Canada.
- In 2012, 80,638 students in Canada were Chinese which representing 30.38% of Canada's total foreign students.

Major Negotiations and Bilateral Agreements

As of 2013, there are 28 treaties with China of which 22 show the status "In Force", 2 "Signed" and 4 "Terminated".

Bilateral Air Links

Air transportation is a direct contributor to a dynamic economy and is a leading trade and tourism facilitator. The capacity entitlement of allowable flights under the air agreement between Canada and China increased by 192.3% between 2005 and 2013. In 2013, 45% of the total number of weekly flights between Canada and China were conducted by Air Canada
